Chapter 2 Post-lesson Architectural Elements

PEDIMENT – a triangular area on the face of a building below the roof, above an entrance.

TRANSOM – a small window above a door letting in light.

BALUSTER – a short column used in a group to support a rail; commonly found on the side of a stairway.
