

A NEW WEBSITE DEDICATED TO PAUL CUFFE LAUNCHED IN 2018

This website is dedicated to documenting current and ongoing research about the lives of Cuff Slocum, Paul Cuffe, Michael Wainer, and their descendants and associates. During the 18th and 19th centuries, the Westport/ Dartmouth/New Bedford area was home to three remarkable families of African and Native American heritage. In an era when slavery was still prevalent in both the South and North and Native Americans were being driven from their homelands, these families provided living testimony to the potentials of the human spirit across all peoples.



WESTPORT'S UNDERGROUND HISTORY









Many of you have probably unearthed interesting artifacts in the woods, fields or even in your own backyard. Unlike other coastal towns, Westport has escaped extensive modern development, and thus retains a high sensitivity for both prehistoric and historic archaeological resources to be present throughout the town. Local archaeological discoveries can shed light on Native American heritage, industrial activities, agricultural and maritime activities.

This summer we are excited to focus on archaeology as a way for us to understand the past and to engage audiences in the future of this field of study. Our new exhibition "Infinite Details" showcases a tiny percentage of two extensive archaeological collections from the Waite-Kirby-Potter site and the Handy House. Taken together these two collections tell a story about our community and the reshaping of everyday life between 1700-1850. By matching these artifacts with probate inventories from those who lived at the Handy House, we can build a vivid picture of the 18th century home.







However, the lure of archaeology is mostly in the "doing," "digging," and "discovering." If you yearn to unleash your inner Indiana Jones, join us for a hands-on Archaeology Day, August 25, and bring your own discoveries for identification.

On July 19 you can hear more about how new technologies can reveal the special archaeological landscape of Westport with Public Archaeology Lab archaeologist Holly Herbster.

WESTPORT'S UNDERGROUND HISTORY Presented by Holly Herbster Thursday, July 19, 7pm Dedee Shattuck Gallery, 1 Partners Lane, Westport

Join Holly Herbster from The Public Archaeology Lab to discover what archaeology reveals about Westport's diverse natural and social landscapes. Westport's history stretches back nearly 12,000 years.

In 2004, The Westport Historical Society funded a town-wide archaeological survey to collect information about known sites and to identify the types and locations of sites not yet documented. The study prompted archaeological projects in town, advances in digital mapping, and collaboration with Wampanoag historians—all of which have added to the story of Westport's deep past.

Holly Herbster is a Senior Archaeologist at The Public Archaeology Laboratory, Inc. (PAL) in Pawtucket, Rhode Island and has spent 30 years researching southeastern Massachusetts history. She was the lead archaeologist for the 2004 townwide survey and has completed more than two dozen archaeological projects in Westport and the surrounding Bristol County communities. 














Westport harbor is simultaneously beautiful and treacherous. Navigating its waters can be a difficult and frustrating experience for sailors. Historically, its deceptive appearance of an unbroken shoreline combined with treacherous currents, led the British in 1812 to refer to Westport Harbor as "the Devil's Pocket Hole".

Retired harbormaster Richie Earle will share memories of his career as Westport's harbormaster. For over 25 years Richie responded to unpredictable challenges such as medical emergencies, lifesaving rescues and beached boats. In conversation with assistant harbormaster Jonathan Paull, they will share photos and stories as well as a historical perspective on earlier harbormasters such as Bob Sykes and Harry Tripp and Ab Palmer.



WESTPORT POINT AND HEAD OF WESTPORT

self-guided walking tours

The Historical Society has been leading guided tours of Westport Point and the Head of Westport for years. This year we invite you to take a self-guided tour of the two most historic villages in Westport. These walking tours highlight historic architecture, from pre-revolutionary houses to stunning Greek Revivals and Victorians from the mid-19th century to a Powder House from the War of 1812 era. Against these architectural details, this walk through history shares little known Westport stories—such as the Westport "pauper" who became the richest man in New Bedford, and the restaurant that was swept away in the 1954 hurricane with the bartender still inside!
